Iowa Legislature, 89th Legislative Session

HF 2333, LSB 5379HH - Bicyclists Right of Way

- Amends 321.327 Pedestrians Right of Way
- Requires the driver of a vehicle to yield the right-ofway to a person riding a bicycle crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk, or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection, in the same manner required when yielding to pedestrians where traffic-control signals are not in place or in operation.
- Did not pass.

State Legislative Session Review

lowa Legislature, 89th Legislative Session

SF 2312 Public Lands

- Prohibits Iowa DNR & CCBs from paying fair market value for land.
- Arbitrarily caps purchase price based on regional estimates, rather than fair market value of each property.
- Denies landowner tax benefits for bargain sales.
- Reported out of Senate Natural Resources and Environment Committee on 2/18/2022, but it did not pass the 2nd funnel on 3/18/2022.



State Legislative Session Review

Iowa Legislature, 89th Legislative Session

SSB3157, Sales and Local Revenues Division VI

- Increases the state sales tax rate and the use tax rate from 6 percent to 7 percent beginning January 1, 2023.
 - Eliminates local option and sales service tax revenue but transfers a portion of state sales and use tax revenues to a local sales and use tax fund.
- This allows for triggering the November 2, 2010, lowa Constitution amendment which created a natural resources and outdoor recreation trust fund to include revenue from the next 0.375 percent increase in the state sales tax.
- Eliminates the ability to use eminent domain for trail development in urban areas which is currently allowed by lowa Code Chapters 6A and 6B; however, this current ability is very seldom utilized.

Traffic Count Programs

Survey

- The lowa DOT bike count program started in 2004.
- The initial locations were chosen by planning agencies around the state and are counted every four years.
- Automatic Traffic
 Recorders (ADR) and
 piezo strips are set on
 paved trails to count
 bicyclists from mid-May
 to mid-September.

- The purpose for the survey is to:
 - gain a better understanding of trail count programs in lowa,
 - type of equipment used.
 - methodology of selecting locations and forecasting results,
 - how trail count results are used and reported, etc.
- The survey will remain open until March 30, 2022.
